Pupil News

On Wednesday 15th June 2022 the children in Y6 participated in a webinar session with Chris Lubbe. This was arranged by the local Leadership Consortium of schools (the Primary Schools in the Bishops Stortford region).

Chris is an engaging speaker and story teller who grew up in apartheid South Africa, and from an early age began to speak out about the injustice of the apartheid system. He has worked with Nelson Mandela (as his bodyguard while he was President of South Africa), with Archbishop Desmond Tutu, FW De Klerk and Colin La Foy. His talk centred around determination, resilience and justice – encouraging others to make positive choices which in turn make a positive impact in our world.

During one assassination attempt a man tried to injure Nelson Mandela, Chris stuck his hand out to protect Nelson.




Position Available
