Safeguarding

Importance of Sleep

Sleep plays a crucial role in the development of young minds. In addition to having a direct effect on happiness, research shows that sleep impacts alertness and attention, cognitive performance, mood, resiliency, vocabulary, learning and memory.

A child who is short on sleep can swing between being grumpy and hyperactive, with effects that can mimic ADHD. Sleepiness can also affect your child's ability to pay attention, with ramifications for their performance in school.

The lead-up to and routine around your child's bedtime is referred to as 'sleep hygiene'. Having good sleep hygiene can help your child to settle to sleep and to stay asleep.

Children 6-12 years 9 to 12 hours Teenagers 13-18 8-10 hours


For the love of Reading


