Enriching the Curriculum

Year 5 went on a Geography field trip this week around town, plotting their route on a map as they walked. They had old photos of sites and buildings from around 100 years ago and set out to



find these locations again. The children took new photos to compare modern-day Bishop's Stortford with the past and identified which features have remained the same. Back at school, they wrote up their findings and reflected on how the town has

changed over time.

Year 3 enjoyed a full day of Design and Technology on Monday. The children have been learning about healthy recipes and spent the morning preparing and writing out the instructions for carrot and sultana muffins.

During the practical session, they practised key food preparation skills, including grating, peeling, measuring and weighing ingredients. The children showed great enthusiasm and were very proud of their finished muffins. They said how delicious they were!
