# Enriching the curriculum

Science week was a great success, starting on Monday with the House mix up event where the children were put into groups of different ages to conduct an experiment around reaction times. The aim was to find out who was guicker: older or younger children? Ask your child about the experiment as perhaps you can try this experiment at home! In their class, the children focused on developing their: presentation of data skills, collecting data and drawing tables

and graphs. Fab Science visited school every day this week to run a number of amazing science workshops for our children based on the theme 'materials'. Year 5 looked at soundwaves, oobleck was put onto clingfilm and placed on top of a speaker, dance music was played through the speaker and the children watched as the liquid (oobleck) turn into a solid material as a result of

the vibrations. Another experiment proved how much liquid a newborn's nappy could hold before it starts to leak. The children used pipets and apple squash to record the amount of liquid that soaked into the nappy. Surprisingly, newborn

nappies can hold two litres of liquid! Today Year 6 made a very sturdy dodecahedron pyramid in their session using bamboo poles and elastic bands. This helped the children to think about engineering and structure. Children throughout the school have deepened their science knowledge whilst having lots of fun.

The Wellbeing, Inclusion and Diversity committee designed an Easter guiz that all years took part in. Congratulations Class 12 for winning the quiz, thank you to the PTA who bought them Easter eggs as a prizes. Thank you also to all the parents that helped with Easter crafts in Reception on Tuesday, the children really enjoyed this fun packed activity.

Throughout the week, selected children from Years 1 to 6 competed in a our house cross country

competition. Congratulations to the Normans who came first. Well done to all the children that took part.

After winning 5-0 against Windhill21 last week in the semi finals, Northgate's Gold team played St. Joseph's on Wednesday evening at Manuden Village Community Centre. It was a great match, although sadly the boys lost on penalties. We feel the team should be very pleased with their achievement.
