Headteacher's News

It has been great to welcome back our Year 3 and 4 this week for the final two weeks of term.

We are currently devising our plan for September based on the latest Government guidance. The majority of the measures that we have put in place this term will remain going forwards into the Autumn term.

Children will be given set gates to enter with staggered starts. We will send out further details of gates in early September before the children return to school on Friday 4th September.

Children, who will be working in their full classes, will be taught the full curriculum. The Autumn term will start with staggered play and lunchtimes, with each class allocated a zone to play in. Movement around the school will be limited and we will not have large groups together such as assemblies.

Initially school meals will be limited to home or school packed lunches that will be eaten in the classroom. The current provision for all children to benefit from free school packed lunches will no longer be in place for Years 3-6, but will continue for Reception, Year 1 and Year 2.

The classrooms will continue to be set up with tables in rows with children using resources from their given packs.

To limit the number of adults within school, unfortunately we are still unable to welcome volunteers until further notice.

Stringent handwashing procedures and extra cleaning regimes will continue. Adults administering first aid will continue to wear basic PPE.

As our pupils have adapted so well to change this term, I am confident that they will adapt to school life in September. I know the staff are very much looking forward to working with their whole class once again.

Reminder that next week is the last week for all year groups.

On Monday 20th and Tuesday 21st July, Year 6 will be performing their socially distanced play at 'Northgate's Outdoor Theatre'.
