Enriching the curriculum

Year 4 travelled back in time on Wednesday to experience life in a Viking village. Dressed in fantastic costumes, the children fully immersed themselves in traditional Viking crafts such as clay moulding, fabric weaving, ink making, jewellery design, and decorating manuscript. They visited the village's wise woman, who treated illnesses using herbs, spices, and bones. The day followed a dramatic storyline, culminating in a fierce battle between the Vikings and the Saxons. In the afternoon, the children became archaeologists, uncovering the remains of the Viking village from earlier in the day. Reminders and Updates

Lateness

Please ensure you leave enough time in the morning to get your child to school in time for registration at 8.50am. Lateness is very disrupting for the teacher and class, but if you do have a valid reason for being late please call the school office in advance and we will inform the teacher. Children who arrive after 9.30am are marked as an <u>unauthorised absence</u> for that session unless there is evidence of an appointment.

Temperatures

On hot days please ensure that a high SPF sun cream is applied to your child before school and please remember sun hats and water bottles. Children must also have a raincoat for days that maybe wet.

<u>Uniform</u>

Skirts, dresses and trousers must be smart school wear. Children in Year 5 and 6 are expected to wear a shirt and tie. Ties are optional in Lower Key Stage 2. Smart black shoes should be worn, without flashing lights (or with the lights turned off). Children are **not** allowed to wear sandals, trainers or boots. No extreme hairstyles, such as tramlines are allowed at school.

Children are <u>not</u> allowed to wear earrings or other jewellery or s<u>mart watches</u> in school. Hair accessories must be in bottle green. **During PE lessons** <u>all children</u> should wear bottle green shorts/green tracksuit bottoms with their white t-shirts.
