Headteacher's News

would normally be at the end of the year. If you would like some support as parents, there are several videos available within the 'Our Learning' area of the school website, along with suggested book lists. You can also see the progression of the reading skills that we teach. Children greatly benefit from discussions around vocabulary so please do talk to them about words they might not understand. Even fluent readers benefit from conversations about what they have read and exposure to new vocabulary. Please sign their reading record to say that you have heard them read. The KS2 children are now beginning to use the library to bring books home again.

Unfortunately, due to financial constraints, we are unable to replace lost reading records without charge. If your child has lost their reading record, they will need to buy a new one for £1. Please put the money in an envelope labelled 'reading record' and send it in with your child to the class teacher.

Safeguarding - Dangerous Parking/Driving

Following several incidents outside school this week, and numerous concerns from our neighbours relating to parking at drop-off and pick-up times, we remain seriously concerned about the safety issues caused by dangerous parking/driving in the streets surrounding our school.

Our primary concern is keeping the children safe, however recent reports have suggested that this is at risk and so measures need to be taken.

The PSCO team will be patrolling regularly in an effort to combat this and will issue fixed penalty notices should the issues continue.

We hope this will go some way to helping improve the situation and would ask you to make the safety of our children your upper most consideration when driving and parking outside school.

In order to reduce the considerable amount of traffic outside school, we would ask you to take advantage of the parking which is available to our parents and carers in the Bishop's Stortford Rugby Club car park at the top of Cricketfield Lane.

We have also received a complaint from a resident of Westfield Road regarding parents congregating at the approach to the pathway leading to school, as well as an increasing amount of cars turning at the end of the road, caused by parents dropping their children at the same point. We would ask that consideration is given to our neighbours in all surrounding roads.

Reading Records

Please can we ask that reading records and school library books are brought into school by the children every day of the week, and not just on the days when they have their library lesson.

Missing Library Books

School library books can be easily identified as they are stamped inside the front cover with the Northgate School stamp and each book has an individual code.

Reminders and Updates

Dogs on School Grounds Can we please remind you that dogs should not be brought past the gate onto school grounds, or tied to the school railings and left unattended. If you are waiting with your dog outside the school grounds, please consider the bottleneck around the school gate and ensure you are standing away from this area. We appreciate your cooperation, especially as some children can be fearful.

School Shoes We have noticed there are still children coming into school in trainers. Please ensure they are now wearing black shoes (not boots). No fashion footwear, light up shoes or trainers please. As shops have reopened, we expect that all children will now come to school in the correct shoes. If your child is unable to wear the correct shoes to school, please ensure an explanatory letter is sent in to your child's class.
