# **Enriching the curriculum**

The EYFS children are sad today as we said Goodbye our baby ducklings who have grown so big they need to back to their farm and pond. All except for our little one, Lucky who was born with a broken



leg. Lucky was taken to a duck sanctuary by one of the Little Ladybird ladies, Amy, mummy to Chloe in Nursery. We have had updates of Lucky's progress and a picture of him with his leg all bandaged up.

Year 3 finished off their volcano sculptures this week. They successfully created the sense of hot magma, volcanic ash and tephra. Well done children.



Year 4 have been looking at classification keys in science. This week we classified Liquorice allsorts ready for our lesson next week when we will classify living things.

In Science, Year 5 are learning about forces.

This week, they investigated how friction will slow down how fast a car can go, and how buoyancy keeps boats afloat. We made our own origami boats and placed them in trays of water, and we pushed cars down ramps made from different materials.

#### Free Relationship Support Courses

OnePlusOne offer free online relationship support courses for Hertfordshire residents. There are three digital resources available for parents:

- Me You and Baby Too To help new and expectant parents adapt to the changes that parenthood can have on their relationship, raise awareness of the impact of stress and conflict on their baby and develop skills to manage conflict constructively.
- Arguing Better To support parents experiencing high levels of stress and couple conflict to raise awareness of the impact on children, increase capacity to cope with stress together and develop skills to manage conflict.
- Getting it Right for Children To support separating or separated parents experiencing high levels of conflict understand the impact on the child, develop positive communications skills, and co-operate in working out solutions.


