# **Headteacher's News**

This week has been National Safer Internet Day and it took the theme 'Want to talk about it? Making space for conversations about life online'. In school, Miss Hartley, our computer lead, led assemblies on the subject and teachers discussed it in the classroom. Safer Internet Day is a great opportunity to focus on online safety with your child. The UK safer internet centre have created a range of pages to help you start a conversation with your child, whatever that may be about and no matter how much time you have.

They suggest the following practical tips for starting a conversation about life online;

- Talk early and often
- Create a safe space for conversations
- Keep it relevant
- Be proactive
