While we appreciate technology can enhance learning, creativity, and problem-solving skills, excessive use can lead to decreased attention span, impact mental health, and impair emotional regulation. At Northgate, only Year 5 and 6 children, who have permission to walk to school independently, are allowed to bring phones into schoolthese are handed into the class teacher.
