Safeguarding—Road Safety

Please can we ask everyone who uses a car at drop off and pick up to be mindful, keep to a slow speed and be aware of everyone around them. Last week, a parent spoke of their concern, as a driver did not appear to be looking and that worried them immensely.

We obviously talk about road safety at school, but it is still vital that this is built on outside of school, reinforcing the learning and setting a good example. It is a topic that even the youngest children can learn something about because they will be using the roads (including pavements), whether they are walking, cycling, scooting or travelling as a passenger in a vehicle.

Let us all stay safe together.

On Tuesday Ruth Horne came into school to talk to Year 5 about the her life during the 6 years of WWII, as well as being evacuated as a young child to the countryside. Ruth has just turned 90 and explained to the classes how life was for her and her sister during that time. Ruth really engaged well with the children and they were fascinated to hear her accounts. Lots of questions were asked and the class were so interested to hear her answers. Below are favorite facts from a few children.



'Doodle Bugs were planes without drivers but when they landed, they exploded!' Martha N Class:

'My favourite facts that she told us were that you would only get 20zs of sweets as part of the rations and about doodle bugs.' Arabelle Class

Year 1 have been reading 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt' by Michael Rosen. The children have been relaying this every day and acting out scenes using lots of different adjectives to describe parts of the story.

In Assembly Mrs Clynes talked about the Jewish celebration 'Yom Kippur' which is a day to reflect on the past year and ask God's forgiveness for any sins. Mrs Smith has reflected this in her dolls house display about Autumn.

Reminders and Updates


