## **Headteacher's News**

We look forward to seeing you in the 'reading with parents' sessions next week; please see the diary for more details. As parents, we are aware of the important part we play in the development and educational performance of our children. Busy lives mean many challenges but parental reading to children increases the child's reading and other cognitive skills at least up to the age of 10–11. This is an early-life intervention that seems to be beneficial for the rest of their lives. The strategy of 'pause, prompt, praise' may help you when listening to children read: pausing to let them work out words if they get stuck, providing a prompt or 'clue' to help (but not giving the answer), and praising them when they concentrate and problem-solve. Reading in an interactive way and having more frequent conversations with your children are particularly important. Support with homework is also important. Research shows that children who regularly complete homework have better school outcomes than children who do not.

As parents, how can you best support your child?

- Create a regular routine and encourage good homework habits which are reinforced with praise and rewards
- Show an interest in what they are doing and give them plenty of encouragement
- Encourage them to set goals, plan, and manage their time, effort, and emotions. This type of support can help children to regulate their own learning and will often be more valuable than direct help with homework tasks.
